OPEN BURN SEASON

Outdoor burn season runs from March 15-October 15. Burn permits are REQUIRED by Clean Air (who regulates burning) for the season and can be purchased at Stein's Ace Hardware or the Clean Air Agency. If you see smoke in the distance, but can't determine what is on fire, odds are it is an outdoor burn, please verify before calling 911. If you plan on doing any outdoor burning, please give us a courtesy call to help prevent false alarms.

Yakima County Fire District 12 is asking voters to consider a 25-cent fire levy lid lift in the August primary election to maintain and enhance service levels.

HOW ARE WE FUNDED?

We are funded through two separate property tax levies for fire and emergency medical service (EMS).

WHAT IS ON THE BALLOT?

We are asking voters to consider increasing our fire levy 25-cents from \$0.89 to \$1.14 on the August 6, 2024, primary election ballot. This will help us keep up with Capital Improvements despite inflation

WHY ARE WE ASKING FOR THIS?


Inflation has diminished our ability to fund capital projects. 2021-2023 inflation averaged 5.7% annually. By law our budget can only increase 1% without a vote for a levy lid lift leaving revenue short of expenses.

WHAT HAVE WE DONE TO COMBAT INFLATION?

- •Adjusted our Capital Improvement Plan to stretch apparatus and equipment dollars without compromising safety and service as far as we safely can.
- •Applied for all grants we are eligible for, to supplement our budget.
- •Not backfilled administrative staffing, the last time we were fully staffed was August 2015.
- •Sold land to Nob Hill Water and leased land for a cell tower.

WHAT WILL THE LID LIFT FUND?

- •Ensuring our Firefighters have safe, reliable equipment and apparatus.
- •Ensuring fire stations are maintained and functional.
- •Enhance firefighter training and abilities to keep up with industry standards and new hazards.
- •Maintain Capital Improvement Plan without affecting staffing levels. **WHAT WILL THIS COST?** The owner of a \$400,000 home (considered average) would pay an additional \$100 per year or \$8.33 per month.



When inflation averages 1.5% the 1% lid limit can keep up through high and low years, however, when inflation averages 5.7% over a three-year period the 1% lid limit cannot sustain fire department operations which is why we are requesting a voter approved lid lift.

When a fire occurs, there is no time for planning. Sit down with your family NOW and make a step-bystep plan for escaping a fire. Draw a floor plan of

your home, marking two ways out of each room, especially in the sleeping areas. Agree on a meeting place your family can meet at once safely outside. Make sure it is out of the way of incoming responders and traffic. Once outside, NEVER go back inside for any reason. Practice your escape plan with a fire drill at least twice a year. Play it safe, make sure your home has working smoke detectors and the batteries are fresh every year. Smoke detectors
