Grant Awards Strengthen Fire District Resources in 2025

The West Valley Fire District is proud to announce the successful award of multiple grants during the first part of 2025. These grant funds will help support critical equipment needs, improve operational readiness, and reduce the financial burden on our taxpayers.

Grants Awarded:

- DNR Phase I Equipment Grant Funding for essential firefighting tools and gear.
- DNR Phase II PPE and Radio Grant Supports the purchase of personal protective equipment and communication equipment.
- NVFC Laptop Computer Grant Provides laptops for training, reporting, and operational efficiency.
- NVFC Drinking Water Grant Ensures access to clean drinking water for responders during extended operations.
- NVFC Training Grant Funds firefighter training to enhance safety and skill development.
- $\label{eq:wastate} \textbf{WA State Legislature Grant} \textbf{Secured funding for emergency}$ power generators at Stations 52 and 54 to ensure operational continuity during power outages.

As part of our ongoing commitment to fiscal responsibility, the District regularly reviews available funding opportunities in alignment with our Capital Improvement Plan. We pursue all grants we are eligible for to help offset rising equipment and infrastructure costs, maximizing the value of our taxpayers' dollars.

These grants directly support our Mission to preserve and protect life and property while maintaining a ready, well-equipped, and professional emergency response force.

Preparing for Wildland Fire Season: Help Protect Your Property and Community

As a residential or commercial property owner in our jurisdiction, there are important steps you can take to support both your safety and the efforts of the West Valley Fire Department in reducing the risk of vegetation fires

The key? Create a buffer around your property - also known as a Defensible Space.

What is a Defensible Space?

A defensible space is a well-maintained zone that extends about 30 feet from any structure. This buffer helps slow the spread of wildfire and reduces exposure to radiant heat, convective heat, and direct flame contact.

Here's how you can create an effective defensible space:

- ✓ Maintain green lawns and use rock or gravel in landscaping. ☑Choose low-combustible plants — think leafy and green, not dry and
- woodv.
- ☑Remove overhanging tree branches near rooftops or structures.
- ☑Clear out items stored under or around decks that could catch fire.
- ✓ Move firewood piles at least 30 feet away from buildings—beyond the 30-Foot Zone.

Additional precautions for areas beyond the **30-Foot Zone**:

- Cutting weeds and grasses to a height of less than 4 inches.
- Creating a 6-foot vertical clearance between the ground and tree
- Removing excess leaf litter and debris that can fuel a fire.
